

To ensure that all pupils engage in at least 30 minutes of physical activity each day and have two sessions of P.E. per week. Children are given play opportunities an average of 1 hour of each school day. The pupils were surveyed to find out what they would like in order to make playtimes more active. As a result, we invested in the Bloqx. Our playtimes show 100% activity on KS1 and an average of 90% activity on KS2 where some pupils use the Calm Zone for games and reading. Our sport extra curricular offer includes football, tennis, karate, little kickers and Dance (this will increase next year). 68% of KS2 pupils engage in extracurricular clubs, exceeding our aim of 50%	2 sessions of PE will continue next year. We will continue to monitor activity on the yard. Our extra curricular offer will increase to include a greater variety of sports as we are a little heavy on football.
