20/04/26	Doubting Thomas John 20: 19-31	The Wise and Foolish builders Matthew 7: 24-7 (R&F)	In collective worship this week we have thought about the ways that Jesus' teaching can give us a foundation for living a good life. We focused on following our Golden Rule.	Reflect on the words of Jesus as a foundation for living. Think about the Golden Rule and write a prayer or a promise with the structure "As I wish for ___ let me ___ for others"
27/04/26	The Sower Luke 8:4-15 (R&F)	Florence Nightingale's Birthday – the value of service 12 th May	In our collective worship we have thought about the good soil in the parable of the Sower, and about how we can be good soil in which to grow our learning from our parents, our teachers, and from Jesus.	Reflect on ways that we can be ready to receive learning and wisdom by listening, thinking and acting and the ways that let our lights shine for ourselves and for others.
04/05/26	Bank holiday Monday (May Day)	The Prodigal Son Luke 15:11-24 (R&F)	In collective worship this week we thought about why God was so happy to have people return to him. We talked about how we could be more like that and spend extra time and energy on people who turn away from friendship – as they need it most!	Reflect on how it feels to be forgiven for doing something we know was wrong. Think about the way that, when we ask for forgiveness, and we really mean it, the people who love us will give it (and this includes God!)
11/05/26 SATS week: worship in classrooms	Ascension (14 th May) Mark 16: 19, Luke 24 50-51	International Day of Families (15 th May)	In collective worship this week we thought about friends we have had to say goodbye to, just as the disciples said goodbye to Jesus at the Ascension. We thought about how good memories and keepsakes help us to be less sad.	International Day of Families – what is a family? Do all families look the same? What needs to be included for it to be a family? Reflect on the way that family feels, and how we can make our school more like a family.
18/05/26	Revered Steele and Sam for Collective worship and prayer spaces for Y1 and Y2	Pentecost (24 th May) Acts 2: 2- 14	In collective worship this week we have been thinking about the Holy Spirit as the part of God that is with us always and will give us courage and help when we need it. We learned about Pentecost as the start of the Christian church.	Think about the first disciples spreading the word of Jesus and reflect on the courage it must have taken. When do we need courage? Write a prayer or a reflection to ask for the courage to shine our light even when it is hard.
01/06/26	INSET DAY	Jesus and the Wedding at Cana John 2 – 1-11 (R&F)	In collective worship this week we have thought about how Jesus' first miracle showed he cared about dignity – he acted so that others would not feel ashamed or embarrassed. Embarrassment is an awful feeling – so we thought of ways that we could make sure we don't embarrass other people.	Consider the importance of dignity. Have we ever lost our dignity and been embarrassed? How did it feel? Reflect on ways that we can save other people for embarrassment, and say a prayer or a promise to never deliberately cause anyone to feel this way.
08/06/26	World Ocean's Day 8 th June – service and stewardship	The Lost Sheep Luke 15: 4-6 (R&F)	In collective worship this week we have thought about the words in Genesis in which God gave his people the role of looking after the earth. We considered the ways in which environmental acts can be thought of as acts of service.	Reflect on the beauty of the ocean and the animals that live there. Think about more that we can do to ensure our oceans are safe for the inhabitants, and write a prayer or a promise to say what we will do.

15/06/26	Jesus Heals a Paralysed Man Luke 5:17-26 (R&F)	Father's Day 21 st June	In collective worship this week we have thought about ways in which God is a good father. We look forward to celebrating fathers' day with the special people who do a dad's job in our lives.	Reflect on the idea of a 'perfect' dad. Share ideas. Is everyone's idea of perfection the same? How do they differ? Would a perfect dad let us do what we wanted all of the time? Consider ways in which dads teach us how to be a good person. Reflect on the person who does that job in our lives, and, if you would like to, say a prayer of thanks to them.
22/06/26	Jesus Calms the Storm Mark 4: 35 - 41 (R&F)	TBA (space provided for visitors – date may change.)	In collective worship this week we have been thinking the peace that Jesus brought to the storm. How can we bring peace to our environment, at home, at school, and in the world?	Think about Jesus bringing peace when the waters of the lake were stormy. Have they ever seen someone bring peace by calming an argument or other 'stormy' situation. How did they make it better. Reflect on ways that we can calm stormy times for our friends and families.
29/06/26	Christian and British Values – letting our light shine!	The Launch of the NHS – link to service (5 th July) Matthew 5:16	In collective worship this week we have thought about ways that we can celebrate the NHS – we made cards and letters for the wonderful people who work so hard for us every day.	Write a prayer or a thank you for the NHS and put it in a birthday card for us to take to the QE (children can choose to take this to a hospital which has meaning to them – or to have them passed to me to the QE)
06/07/26	Jesus Feeds 5000 People John 6:1-13 (R&F)	TBA (space provided for visitors – date may change.)	In collective worship this week we have been thinking about the values of community and generosity. We wondered how different the story would have been if the boy hadn't shared his lunch with Jesus!	Reflect on the word community. Who does this include? If we saw one of our friends was hungry, would we share our food? What about another person in our class, or our street, or our town? Should anyone go hungry? We may not be able to perform miracles, but the ordinary kindness of sharing can make a big difference in someone's day.
13/07/26	Suffrage and Equality (Emmeline Pankhurst's birthday 15 th July)	Year Six leavers' assembly	In collective worship this week we have been thinking about social justice and the bravery of the suffragettes. We wondered whether there were still times when people may be treated unfairly due to their gender, and what we could do to change this.	Reflect on those who are leaving, and consider what we wish for them. Write a prayer or a card for our Year 6 leavers, and if you want to, say a prayer for them.
